- This became the foundation organisation for the reestablishment of logistics within the Iraqi armed forces.

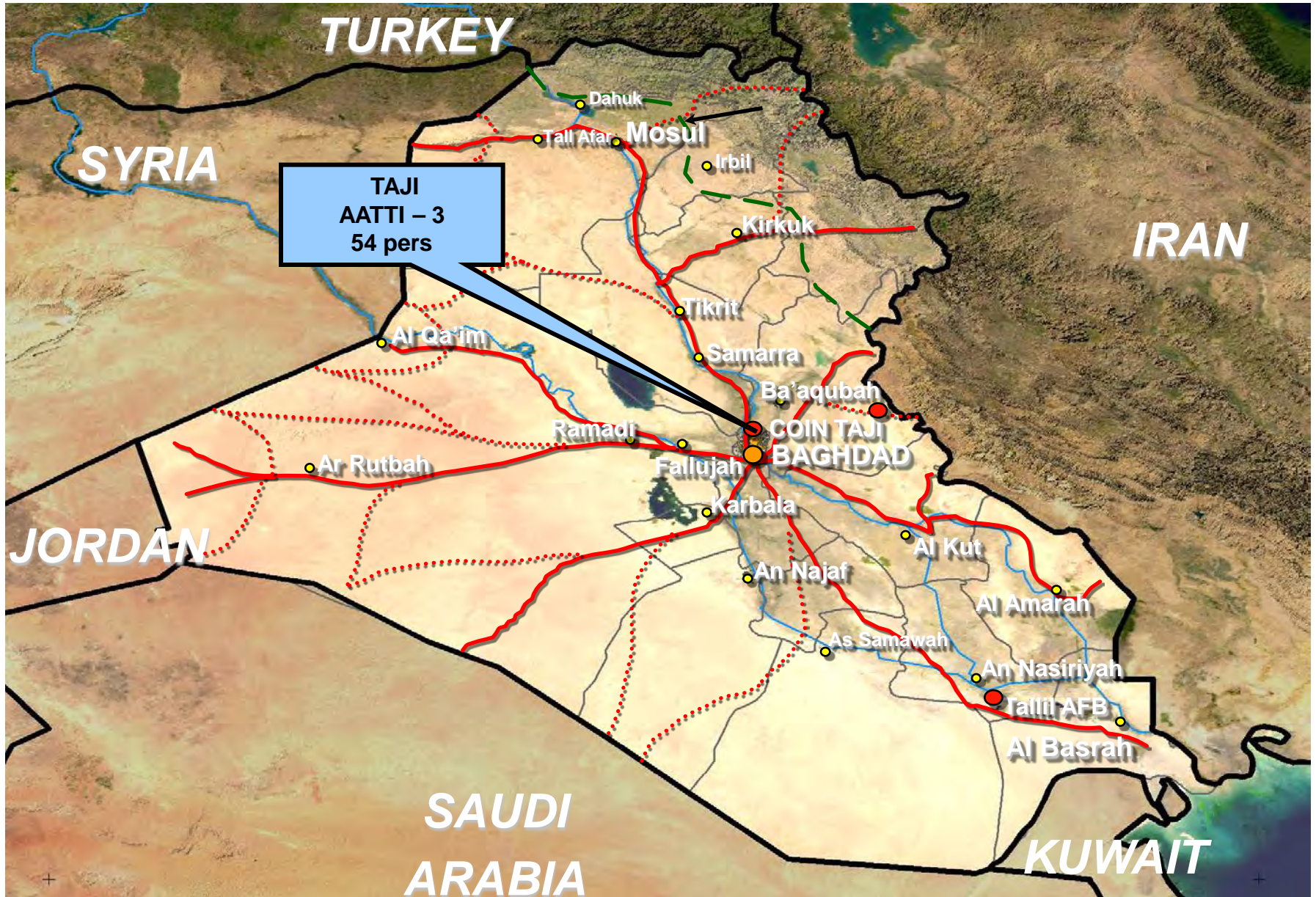
# AATTI-3

  - **Train Iraqi logistics specialists in the support of their combat forces.**

# AATTI-3

- Without a standardised system of logistics doctrine and training, the Iraqi Army was in danger of falling behind in its ability to supply the expanding army.

- Initially, AATTI-3 was focussed on the establishment of the training facilities as they were building this from the ground up.
- A major component to this was referred to IKEA duties.
- In fact IKEA duties was still going on when the first courses started.

- While the Iraqi Army used a large amount of Soviet-era equipment, their logistic chain was based on a British-styled system using first, second, third and fourth lines of logistics due to the British influence post-World War I. This was continued in the training approach which quickly found favour with the Iraqis.

- AATTI-3 graduated their first class on 18 Apr 05
- This was a huge success considering the facilities had just been completed in late Mar.
